Happy Friday Woodland Families!

As the weather is clearing up so are our plans to get some of our students back in the building. First, we want to thank you for giving us so much grace and support as we have had to change plans due to technology and “nature” glitches. As a reminder, we have rescheduled our material pick-up for students to this Monday, September 21st from 10:30 until 6:00 p.m. Let’s cross our fingers for no more glitches!

We know this has not been easy on our families and has even caused great hardships for some. We want you to know that all our Woodland staff will continue working hard to make this situation the best experience it can be for your student during these times. Now as we begin to plan for seeing some of our students face to face, we look forward to that continued partnership and support as we work to create the best and safest learning environments for each student. We are still, as a district, working through these plans and we are sure you have many questions about how we will be modifying our operational practices to keep our staff and students as safe as possible. From health check expectations to what lunch and recess will look like, information is rapidly evolving. Here are highlights from the [PSD Return to School Playbook](#) on how the district is adapting schools, classrooms, large spaces, and transportation while implementing health and safety requirements.

- **Health Screening:** Every morning, parents/guardians will be expected to health screen their child before coming to school and submit an electronic attestation form.
- **Drop-Off/Pick-Up Procedures:** Signage will control traffic patterns and staff will assist students. Each school will have designated entries. Due to health and safety guidelines, students will only be allowed to enter the building 10 minutes before the warning bell (i.e. start of school).

Lunch: Breakfast and lunch will not be served. Students will need to bring their own lunch. Students will eat in supervised classrooms at their own desk. Students who participate in the [free meal program](#) should bring the lunch provided in the 5-meal box.

- **PE and Music:** Specialist time will be held in classrooms to limit movement of student groups.
- **Recess:** Masks will *not* be required, but students will need to socially distance in class groups.
- **Classrooms:** Students will be seated 6 feet apart during class to ensure social distancing.
- **Buses:** No more than two elementary students per seat; siblings can sit together.

Remember, as we reopen for Hybrid A/B Model in-person instruction, parents have a choice in how and when their child returns to school. Families have the option to remain in full-time [Continuous \(Distance\) Learning](#) even when in-person learning resumes.
